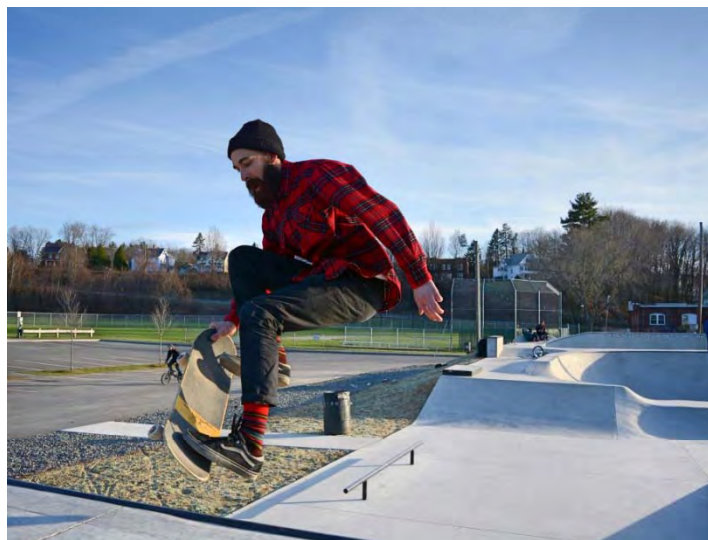

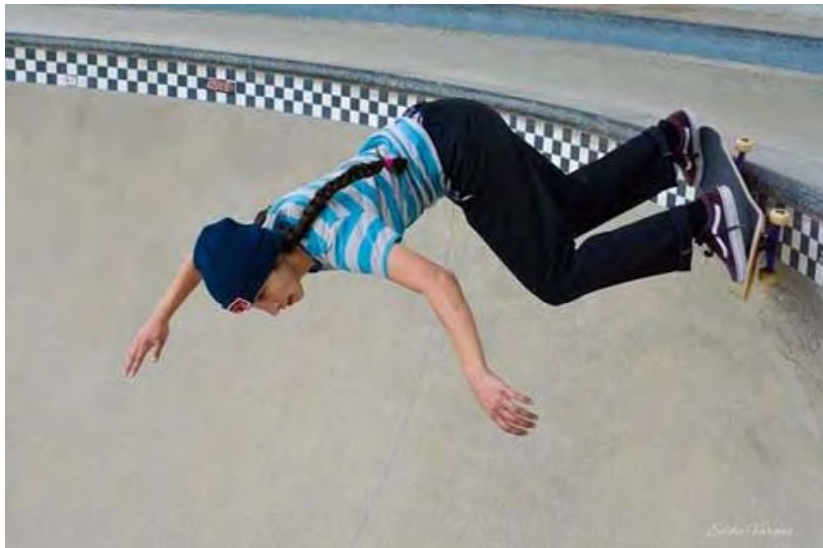

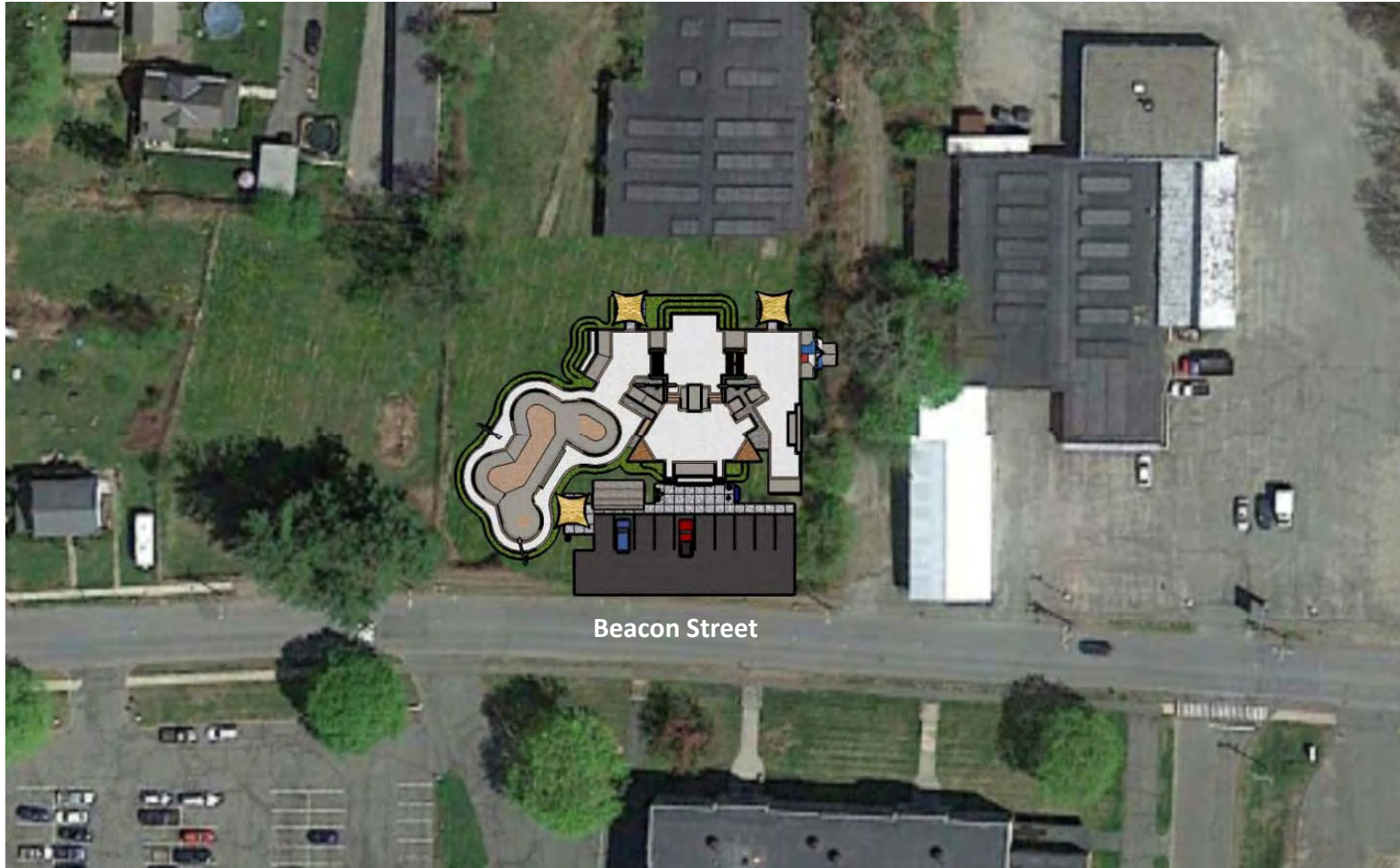
Greenfield's Former Skate Park

Greenfield's first Skate Park was dismantled in the fall of 2010 after the property lease expired. It was also determined that the ramps had heavily deteriorated and were not salvageable. The Skate Community was heartbroken from the loss and has continued to lobby for a new park to this day.



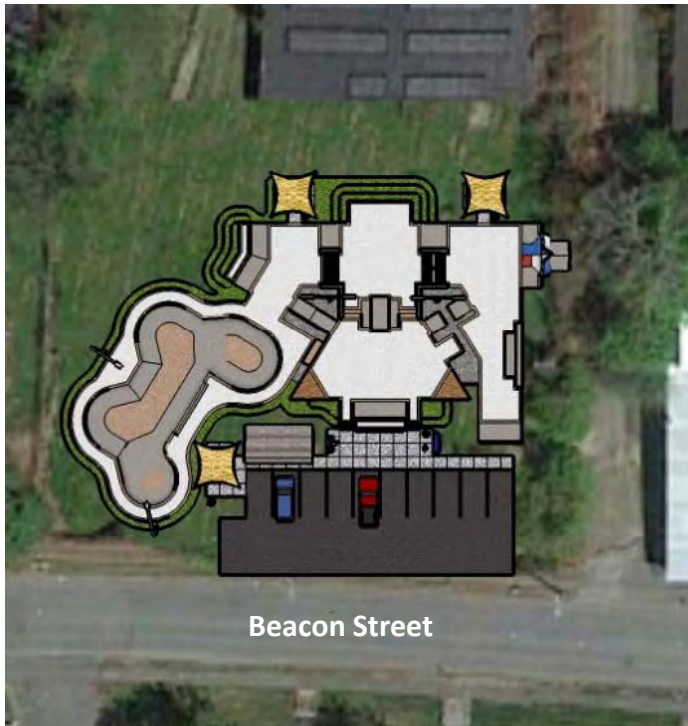

Skate Arts Park Funding Strategy

- Total Income \$ 1,109,180

Skate Arts Park Funding Strategy

• Construction Skate Park	\$550,000
• Parking Lot	\$100,000
• Enclosure Wall, Fencing and Gates	\$36,000
• Lighting	\$24,000
• Plumbing & Electrical	\$30,000
• Bioswale and Guard rails	\$22,500
• Professional Services (Engineer, architect, etc.)	\$60,125
• Abatement & Demolition	\$145,000
• Site amenities (benches, bike racks, trees, etc)	\$42,080
• Contingency & General Conditions 15%	\$79,456
• Grant administration	\$20,000
• Total Expenses	\$1,109,180
