SWIM LESSON LEVEL DESCRIPTIONS

The Greenfield Recreation swim program is designed to help swimmers at every level to experience more success and less frustration with learning the fundamentals of swimming. Below are descriptions for each level of the program. All lessons held at the Green River Swimming Area.

Wave Runners - ages 3 and 4

Exploration of water activities and readiness. Parent is not with child during lesson.

Level 1 - Water Exploration - ages 5 and above Learn to hold breath under water; float front and back; kick on front and back with help; walk in shallow end.

Level 2 - Primary Skills

Must have passed Level 1. Learn to swim under water; float without help; flutter kick; swim combined strokes for distance; retrieve object from shallow end.

Level 3 - Stroke Readiness

Must have passed Level 2. Bobbing in water over head; learn diving; front and back crawl strokes; elementary backstroke; reverse direction without stopping; tread water for time.

Level 4 - Stroke Development

Must have passed Level 3. Deep water bobbing; rotary breathing; deep water diving; swim 4 basic strokes for distance; tread water for time with different stroke kicks.

WILD FLOWER WALKS

The forest surrounding our Green River Swim Area is a unique treasure among natural settings in its abundance of Spring Ephemerals. Spring Ephemerals are the first wildflowers to push their way up through the thawing forest floor. Their delicate blossoms provide nourishment for many of the early insects. Ephemerals typically grow, bloom, and form their seeds above ground during a very brief time. From their leaves, to their blossoms, even to their interesting names, Spring Ephemerals are an absolute delight to nature enthusiasts. Please join us on a wildflower walk to see Dutchman's breeches, squirrel corn, toothwort, bloodroot, trillium, and so many others.

Wear sturdy, comfortable walking/hiking shoes, and layers of clothing to accommodate the weather. Although much of our time will be on relatively flat ground, the hike is of moderate difficulty. Participants are encouraged to bring a water bottle and your favorite means of identifying native plants.

If the unpredictable weather happens to cause the Ephemerals to finish blooming before our walks, there will still be much to see, sadly focused on the invasive species that are threatening the forest.







Registration Info

REGISTRATION INFORMATION

All programs require pre-registration unless otherwise noted. Parents/guardians may only register immediate household/family members. Registrations are accepted on a first-come first-serve basis until the maximum number of participants is reached. Program fees are due at time of registration. An individual is considered registered when payment and registration form have been accepted or they complete online registration. Registration forms will not be accepted unless they are legible and complete. No phone registrations accepted.

Walk-In Register in person at the Greenfield Recreation Department office located on the 2nd floor at 20 Sanderson Street. Completed registrations can also be left in the drop box next to the front door.

Mail-In Register by mailing in your registration form and payment to the Greenfield Recreation Department, 20 Sanderson Street. Include a self-addressed Stamped envelope if you need a receipt. The Recreation Department is not responsible for lost or late mail.

Online Online registration can be completed by following the registration link on our website. User names and pin numbers are sent out via email to all users in our database with valid email addresses. All new accounts must be approved before online registration can begin. Online registration closes one week prior to the program start date. Season passes can only be renewed online, new registrations will have to be submitted in person or by mail.

Residency For purpose of registration: **Resident** is defined as one who resides in the City of Greenfield. **Non-Resident** is defined as one who resides outside of the City of Greenfield. Only registered participants are permitted. Visitors and guests are strictly prohibited.

Age/ Grade Requirements Age or grade requirements are established for each program and are strictly enforced to ensure equity for all citizens. In camp and sports programs, grades are used to determine eligibility. Campers or players are not permitted to move up a division regardless of age, size, or ability. Failure to accurately represent your child's age or grade during registration is grounds for immediate dismissal from the program without refund.

Swim Area Age Policy Persons younger than 9 years of age must be accompanied by a responsible person 16 years of age or older.

Waiting Lists The Department will maintain wait lists at no cost and will attempt to offer additional classes for programs with large wait lists.

Cancellation Classes may be cancelled or relocated due to weather, low enrollment, or in other unexpected situations. All class cancellations and program changes will be available on the cancellation phone line: (413)772-1553 x 4. Notices will also be posted on Facebook. If a program has not met minimum enrollment requirements one week prior to the first class, it will be cancelled and a full refund will be given.

Withdrawal/ Refunds Individual program withdrawal refund requests must be made at least seven days prior to program start. Refunds not issued after program has begun unless due to medical emergency, where a physician's note must be submitted as proof of inability to participate. No refunds issued for non-attendance or lack of participation. A \$5 administration fee will be assessed to all program withdrawals. Refunds will be issued in check form or back to the original credit card. Refunds will not be issued in cash. Allow 2-4 weeks for a refund check to be processed and mailed. Programs with special policies void the preceding. Swim Area Season Pass Refunds No credits or refunds for Swim Area Season Passes will be issued after May 31st. No credits or refunds will be issued for unused pass(es). No credits or refunds will be issued for park closure due to inclement weather, water quality testing, maintenance, city ordinance, events, or other closures.

Inclusion Services The Greenfield Recreation Department encourages those with disabilities to participate in our programs and events. The Department will comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act in providing reasonable accommodations.

Financial Aid If a customer is unable to pay due to hardship, they can request an Application for Reduced Fee. All requests are confidential and considered on an individual basis. Only residents of the City of Greenfield are eligible for scholarship funding.
