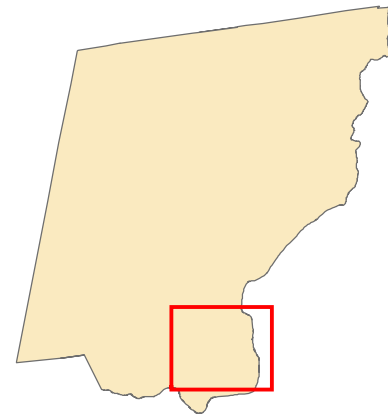
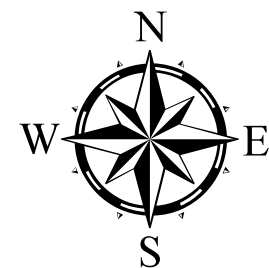

#### Trail System Description

The Highland Park section runs south from Mountain Road to Sachem Head. Many trails in this last section are suitable for cross-country skiing in winter. This section include the Ridge Trail, which is blazed in blue and runs down the top of the rocky ridge that gives the area its name. This trail is a continuation of the Pocumtuck Ridge Trail running from the Sugarloaves in South Deerfield, and it provides spectacular views of Greenfield and the surrounding hills all along its length. Parallel trails on both sides of the ridge, blazed in red or green, provide a woodlands experience. They are connected to each other by frequent cross trails, blazed in yellow, unless otherwise marked.
