Rec Room Summary

The inaugural year of the Rec Room was an overall success! The program started with 18 members and grew to 23 for the Winter and 24 for the spring semester. 5th graders made up the majority of the enrollment. Daily attendance typically fluctuates between 8-14 students per day.

Highlights from the school year include daily Rec Round-ups where members were presented with a variety of stimulating topics to discuss as a group; STEM enrichment projects such as volcanoes, model DNA, and elephant toothpaste; arts such as clay figures, paper-mache, and sewing; and community collaboration with MPress from Greenfield Savings Bank to introduce money management. Outside group games and the game room were also member favorites and fostered socialization and positive interactions between peers.

One of the biggest challenges of the program included staffing. While the program was able to function with two staff, three would be ideal as it would allow more flexibility with programming, oversight, and one on one interactions/mentorship of members. Staff call-outs and absences were also difficult to find coverage for and a third staff member would alleviate this strain.

Overall, the Rec Room has been a success and provided a safe and welcoming space where new friendships have blossomed. We are excited for the Rec Room's continued growth next school year where we hope to expand enrichment, provide more community engagement activities, and help a new round of middleschoolers grow!


